MINUTES OF MARAC, INC JUNE 6, 1970

The regular meeting of HARAC, INC was held June 6, 1970 at the QTH of MAGWOB at 8 PM CDST. Members present were WAGWOB, WAGPJK, WGSJE, WAGKQQ, WGYLN, UGAYL, and WAGSEE.

The reading of the minutes of previous meeting was approved as distributed to all members. Motion by WAØKQQ - seconded by WAØPJX.

Treasurers report: Balance on hand June 1st \$584.64.

The president asked for a report on the newsletter. WFIN, the editor reported on all comments, gripes and other news items he has received for the newsletter. These comments will create a new section to the newsletter. He read several memos from members and these were discussed at length. The newsletter will be ready to be mailed as soon after this meeting as the material can be formulated. The membership cards will also be mailed to all members with the newsletter, wFSJE was asked to comment on the charter membership certificates. The finished certificates were shown to the members present and rejected. Another artist was called to the meeting and after discussion by the members, the certificates will be re-lettered. The charter membership certificates will be ready by June 13th.

Discussion on having the Independent County Hunters annual meeting in Kansas City followed. We plan to offer a complete program with activities for all. We are all members of ICaN as well as MakAC and intend to ask for the convention in Kansas City as ICa members, not as MakAC members.

AWARDS

***WOUDL - It is very frustrating to us county hunters when we have to put up with malicious interference by those members of the amateur fraternity who vehementally dislike our net operations. I suspect that there are others as well who go out of their way to give the various nets a bad time. One example might be a person whom has purchased his ham equipment but has flunked his license exam. Of course he has it in for all amateur operations and operators. It is too bad that the people that sell amateur equipment cannot require proof of an amateur license prior to selling the gear. This is not a cureall but might help a little.

anyhow, we have a problem with intentional interference on a net; we can do some things, as individual operators to help get rid of this problem.

1. Don't mention it on the air, since this only informs the offender that he is accomplishing his purpose.

- 2. Take note of the following items on a seperate log:
 - A. Time and date of interference.
 - B. Duration of interference.

C. Type of interference in your opinion.

D. Strength of signal and fade characteristics.

- E. If you have means of telling, the direction from which the interfering signal is coming.
- F. Any other pertinant data which might be valuable in locating and closing the interfering station.

The most difficult thing will be to determine if the interference is actually intentional and will have to be determined by the individual. Put all this information in writing and send it to your Engineer-In-Charge of the district you are in. The FCC wants it in writing for their files. In most cases, telephone calls don't help much, but several letters will get some action started. We must begin helping fight the interference problems but do so by using a uniform and proper procedure. Of course, it goes without saying we must keep our own house clean at all times, especially when we invite the monitor stations to listen to our own operations in response to our letters. If anyone has available data on a simple loop antenna for basic direction finding, it would be well to make such information available to those that are interested in building one.

Another subject: If you are inclined to take net control, then by all means take it - whether or not you have experience at it. There is only one way to get that experience, and that is to wade right in to your chin and make sure you don't drown. In order to maintain any order or sense, in this business of net operations, the net control station must have control of the net at all times, otherwise you have nothing but confusion. Whether or not you like or dislike the net control on any basis and for any reason, it is still no reason to make operations difficult and spoil the fun for the rest of the stations. Let me give you a personal example and I won't hold any punches. When I first started to listen to the 20 meter independent county hunters net, the one net control that really went against me was W7KOI. OK, I admit it, but after two or three sessions listening to him conduct the net my respect grew for him as a net control station because he had the attitude of either you get the counties or you don't and if you don't there is always another time. I don't even know 97KOI, it makes no difference at this point and I'm sure he won't be offended by what I have said. Editor's note - Gary wrote much more and it will be published as space permits.

WAØSKQ - I noticed something the other day that worked very well. Thile one of the stations that gets enjoyment out of causing CRM for the 20 meter county hunters was preparing to call one of his many "CQ's", W4HA, John called him and said, "Sir, you are on a very busy frequency, thank you for asking if the frequency is in use". This courtesy caught the "pest" so far off guard that he was quiet the rest of the day. He was looking for the county hunters, and since John didn't mention county hunters, he was so disapprointed he didn't get his thrill for the day and we heard no more of him.

WAICXE - Now about a frequency for mobile operations that won't interfere with the county hunters? Why not have the mobile stations give their county about every four or five contacts so the fixed stations will know where the mobiles are and won't have to break in and ask?

KØAYO - I understand a couple of the mobiles have been recepients of FCC type QSL'S for failing to include /MØ after their call. Seems KØAXX/ mobile in such a county and state won't satisfy the requirement.

Along this same line, many stations, fixed and mobile are failing to identify with both calls at the end of a contact. Tail-ending is legal at the start but the last call must contain both calls. Just food for thought, Another pet peeve - failure by net controls to announce the county and state prior to running for the benefit of all those copying 3/3 and 4/4. This should eliminate about 75% of the net confusion. One last item - what ever happened to mobiles and DX first and just wait and see where he is going next? Wa6KHN - Had a good time on the trip to Mack's Inn, Idaho. Not much sleep, a lot of chinning and saw a lot of nice country. I think I know where I want to retire in 18 months. The trip took in 54 counties, 289 contacts and 2895 miles and one generator!
