When responding to a report from when responding to a report from another station, the number of times you should REPEAT the report you are giving him depends on how well he is hearing you. A readability of five, by definition, is "perfectly readable." If you receive a five - anything from him, it should not be necessary to give his report more than once or twice; ie, "you are five-seven, fifty-seven." On the other hand, a two-anything means he is barely hearing you, so your report to him should be hearing you, so your report to him should be repeated several times. Conversely, when ACKNOWLEDGING the other station's report to you, it is seldom necessary to repeat it more than once; ie, "got the 2-2, 2-2, 2-2, 2-2" is repetitious and time consuming; a simple "got the 2-2" will suffice. The other station may not hear your acknowledgment, but others on the net surely will, and the NCS or someone will let you know if you got the wrong report. I Incidentally, if you are giving the other station back the same giving the other station back the same report he sent you, the word "also" is dynamite; it will often get thru under marginal condx when nothing else will.

Using The Mobile Reply Card

(From The Mobile QSL Bureau)

The Mobile Reply Card (MRC) was designed to permit mulitple contacts on one card as the mobile station you are working travels from county to county. An example of such a card and how the cards should be completed is indicated above.

- The call of the MOBILE you contacted.
- 2. YOUR call.
- Date of the contact. Remember the date changes after 2400.
- Time of contact. Use UTC This is a must.
- The frequency of the contact.
- The signal report you RECEIVED from the mobile.
- The state the mobiler was transmitting from.
- The county the mobiler was transmitting from.
- Leave blank, the mobiler will complete.
- Leave blank, the mobiler will complete.
- Leave blank, the mobiler will sign confirmation here.

As you can see, the cards are filled out as if the mobile station were sending the card to you! The sample card shown is just one of many types available from different sources. Regardless of the style you use, the required information and placement is similar.

Resetting the ICOM IC-02AT Re-visited

(From QST, June 1990)

Holding the FUNCTION button in while turning the radio on will reset the micro only on radios with a serial number above 34,000. On IC-02AT's with lower serial numbers, the internal reset button must be pushed while the radio is powered up. A special technique can make this easier: Remove the battery and tip the radio straight back so you are looking at the battery slide plate. Remove the upper-left screw from the plate. The reset button is about 3/4 inch in from the edge of the screw hole.

Power the radio via the top-panel power jack and turn it on. Insert a small plastic tuning tool, or similiar tool, with a little bend in the end into the screw hole to push the reset button. You've achieved reset when you hear a tone from the radio speaker. If reset is normal and the radio has not been modified for out-of-band operation, its display will show 140,000 and not 144,00 as described in QST, Sep 1988. If the radio has been modified such that its display indicates 0.00, then you have some work ahead of you. Enter 9.995 and push the up arrow button so the display shows 10.00. Do this 13 more times to get to 140 Mhz. Some early units in the 8000 serial-number range had an experimental reset circuit that allowed reset like that in units above 34,000. Try it to see if you have one!

AWARDS FORMS

Filling Out the Last County Form

This question continues to come up so please bear with me as I repeat this comment from last month as it seems necessary in order to get it correct. Although most folks have no problem using the new form I do want to suggest an easy way to keep things straight when you are using it. Bear in mind that you received a Last County contact from someone and that's why you are going to give that person an award. The award is from YOU to THE OTHER PERSON. So your call goes in the FROM block and TOP's call goes in the TO block. You might look at the form as a catalog order form with an alternate shipping address. Ergo, you are ordering a Last County Award to be shipped to TOP. Hope that helps to make sense.

When Is a Last County Last?

Not too very long ago I received a phone call and the caller was puzzled over what to do about a Last County award he had given to someone only to find out that he was not going to be able to get that contact confirmed. Now he was faced with someone else going out and getting him that county as a rework and he wanted to know whether that was a Last County.

This is not the first time that this question has come up, nor will it be the last. One possible solution would be to give the station going after the rework county for you a Last County award for his effort. In effect you would be giving two last county awards for that state but the Awards Custodian does not audit the Last County awards in that manner. You can give a Last County, Cat. 1 award for any reason you choose and many people are doing just that. That's why the latest revision of the Last County Award application form has space on it for many reasons other than just the USA-CA award (the first time around).

So if you are faced with a rework county being the last county one possible solution would be to give the person who gave you the contact for the rework a Last County Award. Your choice. I have given as many as four awards for a single contact since the one contact finished up the state four ways.

AWARD GUIDELINES

Included in the July printing of the Annual Report is a current and complete set of MARAC award rules. This information also includes the complete listing of award fees. I will keep on repeating them here in hopes that everyone will get the message BUT as of Aug. 1, 1990, I will return any applications that do not have the correct fee enclosed. Remember - if you are a current MARAC member, the basic award fee for all awards except the Five Band award is \$2. If you are a nonmember or you have let your dues lapse, then the fee is \$3. See the award rules for all other fees.

If you would like a complete copy of the Award Rules, send the Custodian a large (#10) SASE with 45 cents postage for the complete set.

AWARDS HISTORY

If you would like a copy of your awards history, drop me a note with an SASE and I'll send you a current printout. I can also print a listing of the Last County Awards that you have applied for. Again an SASE would be much appreciated.

NEW AWARDS

I thought last month we had a really big month, but this month is even bigger which is partly influenced by the Annual Best Mobile and Best Net Control awards. Here is a summary of the awards issued during the past 30 days plus there were about 430 Last County Cat 1 awards issued.

The Best Mobile awards this year go to NØCYB for First

Place CW and to N9DEH for SSB. The Second and Third Place winners were W1TEE and W4HSA for CW and WB4FBS and WAØSBR for SSB.

The Best Net Control Awards went to WA6VJP for CW First Place and WØUM for SSB First Place. Second and Third Place honors went to NØDPF and W6NNV for CW with N7BKW and WØGOQ pulling in the SSB honors.

The 1990 Custodians Award winner this year is Carl Durnavich, WA9PQY who not only submits his awards in a very timely fashion but does so accurately and with very legible printing thusly helping the custodian get over the migraine headache.

Only one Five Band Counties Award winner this month. WB3HTK takes the honors by getting basic award #37. He also received endorsement #13 for 20M SSB All Mobiles and #31 for SSB 20M Basic. Congrats Walter.

The Jack Scroggins awards this month went to K8MDU who worked 75 second timers and N2JNE who worked ten holders of the Second Time Award.

The only Mobile Achievement Award this month was picked up by AA4HD who earned it for transmitting from all Georgia counties on 20M SSB.

The Mobile Award has some winners this month also. AA4HD picked up the Cat 1 award for transmitting 18 states. WA8RSQ worked KB7QO in 50 states Mobile to Mobile so he and Ken both got the MARAC Mobile plaque for their work. KB7QO also picked up a Cat 2 award for transmitting 25 states to WD4NEG. K7GJZ upgraded his award to the Red Seal level by working W3XE in 25 states. WD4NEG also got the Cat 2 award for working KB7QO in 25 states. KB7QO got a Cat 4 award for transmitting 100 counties to WD4NEG and WD4NEG got the Cat 4 award for working Ken in 100 counties.

The Last County Category III Award is awarded for transmitting multiple Last Counties. We have several winners this month at various levels. All Cat 3 awards are issued with all seals for the certificate and the MARAC Mobile Plaque with appropriate engraving. New this time around is NW10 picking up his first Cat 3 award for transmitting 25 LC's from 10 states between 6/20/81 and 2/25/89. K6QWH entered the Cat. 3 activity this month with picking up his first Cat. 3 for transmitting 25 Last Counties. K6QWH roamed around six states between 4/30/80 and 6/6/90 doing his deed. WG9A stepped up to the 50 LC level this month by collecting the #73 award for doing his act from 5 states between 10/23/89 and 6/12/90.

K9DCJ was back on the road this past month and ended up getting a new level of Last County awards. Arnie has now picked up the #2 award at the 500 level. Special congrats Arnie. He also at the same time got the #2 award at the 475 level. These 50 LCs were done between 1/20/88 and 6/12/90 from only two states.

Also getting into higher levels of achievement, KB5FU got his #8 and #5 awards for 275 and 300 Last Counties respectively. WA9PQY and K5VYT both broke the 100 level this month. PQY got the #40 award at that level and VYT got the #39 award. Both get the MARAC Special Plaque and an opportunity to earn endorsements bars to go on their new plaques. WØFF and KY9Y both entered the 50 level this month with Foxxy Fox getting the #74 award and Owen pulling in the #75. VE1AIT achieved the 75 level this month by getting the #38 award for 75 Last Counties.

The Last County Award Category II is achieved by giving someone the last county in the US. This is frequently referred

to as the Whole Ball of Wax award. It actually includes the award for the Last in the State AND also includes the award for the last in the US. If you are applying for this award for someone DO NOT include a separate fee for the Last in the State award. It is included in the fee for this award. The winners this month include N6ERM who took a trip to Knox, KY and gave WA9PQY his last. KA9JOL finished em all up this month and got his USA-CA #. He had lots of support but WB9YCO managed to give him the last of all from Shawano, WI. ZL2ACP gave WD4HRN Clay's last which was Lanier, GA. VE2YM ran around the country earlier this year and ran into Stevens County Kansas which KØOJG needed for his last. WA9PQY was on the road too giving the Last of All to N9DEH and AK8A so Carl gets two such awards this time. WI9C picked up one this month by giving N9DEH his last for Third Time Around. KI6YX ran out to Knox, KY and gave WA9PQY his last for the whole thing. N4UGH happened to be in Lenoir, NC when WB2NFB was on the air needing it for his last of all. WA4NBC, Clark had to drive all the way to Osage County, Missouri in order to give W5VDW his last of all for the Second Time Around.

If you have ever worked all 18 of the Union Counties, then you are eligible for the Union County Award. We had three new winners of the Union County award this month. WØUM, W6NNV and WØFBB all got new awards this month. All three worked all Union Counties and got the award with all seals.

The MARAC Merit award was awarded to several folks this month for their efforts in conducting the annual MARAC convention. The winners of this award are WA3TUC and XYL, WB3HTK and XYL, K5OUK, W3XE, and KA3DR. WA3TUC also received the Merit Plaque for convening and conducting the fine convention. N6QA, WA5DTK and N4FSZ each received the MARAC Merit Plaque for their conducting and organizing the annual contests and QSO parties.

The USA Counties Award can be earned by working counties in the various call areas. Ten such awards can be earned, one for each area plus one for the whole U.S. N4UMR gave us his list of all counties worked and confirmed so he receives the #41 award with all seals this month.

Once each year the Presidents selects one individual from among the membership who is most deserving of recogniation for his work and support of MARAC objectives and ideals. This year, President Don, WAØLKL has recognized KM4W for his many years of effort and support in the SE District. Bill receives the President's award for 1990.

From Nine Land NG9L took time to update his records and thus upgraded his YL Mobile award to the 1000 Contact level getting the double gold seal for his certificate.

The M-50-M Award is earned for working mobiles in 48, 49 or 50 states with an endorsement for doing it all mobile. We had four winners of this award this month with N4UMR, WØUM, WWØG, and WØFBB all getting their awards with Red and Blue seals for working all 50 states with Mobiles.





COUNTY HUNTERS LAST COUNTY AWARD APPLICATION BOOK

The MARAC Last County Award is one of the most popular awards sought after on the Ham Bands today. With volumes running into the several thousand each year, it is necessary that some form of specific application form be used to help the awards custodian in the processing of these awards.

MARAC has for some time made the application form available at no cost other than an SASE and there is no change to that procedure. Simply put, if you will send an SASE to the Awards Custodian, the Last County Application blanks will be sent back to you by return mail. As many forms as posssible will be sent for the units of postage that you put on the envelope. Usaully about 12 forms can be sent for one unit of postage.

If you would like to have a slightly more convenient form of keeping track of the Last County award forms, you may want to consider the Last County Award application book as made available by The B&B Shop. No stamps to fool around with, no envelope to have to mail in, no forgetting that you are about out of the blanks, and a set of handy guidelines to help you in completing the forms.



The Last County Award Application book is padded with a binding for easy removal of the application slips as you need them. Sized 3½" X 8½" it will probably fit into the cubby hole in your desk or one of the drawers for easy use when you need it. No more messing around with loose forms and not being completely sure on how to fill out the blanks.

This padded book comes with 50 Category One blanks, Two Category Two blanks, and Two Category Three blanks. Also included in the book is a sample blank showing how the forms should be completed along with two pages of instructions to help you.

No more messing around with big envelopes, the right count of stamps and forgetting to get it mailed on time. Simply get the Last County Award Application book and use it in place of the loose forms.


