A real good suggestion from George, WYENA, (and used by Ed, W2GT); in the future, take the official list (available from the same Ed) and convert the alphabetical list to numerical— i.e. 1. Adams, 2. Alpha, 3. Baker etc. then submit (for next month) the numbers for the counties you need in Arizona and Arkansas. This eliminates a lot of writing, as well as worry about how they are spelled!

CAN WE DO IT BETTER? A lot of good suggestions to improve our operation;

so just for openers, how about "suggestions for mobilers"?

1. Give your call frequently, and use phoenetics.

2. Give your county and state often. Remember to use phoenetics on the first few letters of the tough to understand ones.

3. If you have good conditions and a lot of callers, consider taking calls by districts or by letter groups.

4. If you are good, asking the hunters to space their calls and working

them in groups saves a lot of time.

5. Pay attention to your net control, and keep him informed. If you can't wait, let the net control know, and expect to be taken off frequency. These suggestions from WAIGW, WAKRE, W9CNG, K9KKX and WGGV.

ENDS 2200 GMT MAY 4. METHODS: Use all bands, C.W. and phone. The same station can be worked and counted for QSO points on each band and mode. Single operator stations only. EXCHANGE: NEBRASKA stations send QSO number, RS/RST and County. Others, QSO number, RS/RST and ARRL section. FREQUENCIES: 1815, 3600, 3982, 7100, 7260, 11100, 11300, 21070, 21325, 28050, 28600. SCORING: OUT OF STATE, Total Nebraska contacts x 3 points x counties. NEBRASKA stations will multiply ARRL sections plus a maximum of ten foreign countries by the total number of contacts made. MOBILES AND PORTABLES: The Lincoln ANC is pushing activity from many counties. Be alert for stations changing counties, as they may be worked again on same frequencies. AWARDS: NEBRASKA: A CERTIFICATE to top scorer in each county. OTHERS, a certificate to top station in each ARRL Section and Country. LOGS: Show Date, Time in GMT, exchange sent and received, band, mode, and points. A summary sheet with scoring, and name and address in block letters. Mail to Lincoln Amateur Radio Club, Michael Nickolaus, WAØKCD 4921 Tipperary Trail, Lincoln, Nebr., 68512. Enclose a large SASE for results. WAØJRZ and WAØKGD will be in North Central Nebr.
